THE HOTSPOTS

Madison County has diverse geology, elevation, and physical conditions, creating a wide range of habitats for a diversity of birds. We have selected locations with different seasonal peaks, different resident and migrant bird population. Regardless of where you're coming from and what you're looking for, this brochure and the accompanying digital materials should help. Scan the QR codes to get to the website.

RIVER ROAD

River Road, which starts in Hot Springs, under the 25/70 bridge, and stretches 6 miles north (downstream), offers some of the best opportunities for diversity in the county.





Watch for eagles, Ospreys and 5 species of swallows over the river. During the winter months check the river for waterfowl such as Hooded and Common Mergansers. Watch the edges of the French Broad for Wood Ducks. In springtime Spotted and Solitary Sandpipers move through. Yellow-throated Warblers, Northern Parulas, Orchard and Baltimore Orioles regularly nest throughout the valley. Listen for rails and Whiteeyed Vireos near the marshes past Murray Branch.

MAX PATCH

Max Patch Mountain and Max Patch Road are great places to visit, starting in late April through the fall. Heading up the hill to Max Patch, stop in wooded areas to hear Wood



Thrushes, Black-throated Blue Warbler and Hooded Warblers. As you approach the top, listen for Veerys. Ravens are regulars at the summit. Migrating hawks including kettles of Broad-winged Hawks



come through in spring and fall. During the spring migration look for American Redstarts, Blackburnian Warblers, Canada Warblers, and Chestnut Sided Warblers around the Max Patch parking area and along the Horse Trail. Check out the pond area for Acadian Flycatchers. In the summer listen for Peewees and Least Flycatchers in the woods.

SANDY MUSH GAMELANDS

Sandy Mush Game Lands is a well known spot for birding due to the diverse habitat, including well managed native grassland. Sandy Mush Game Lands is 2600 acre comprising several nearby



land tracks. There are a number of parking areas and well developed trails throughout.

It's definitely the best place around to see early successional species like Grasshopper Sparrows, Blue Grosbeaks, Savannah Sparrows, Common Yellowthroat, Prairie Warblers and Yellow Breasted Chats. There are actively maintained Kestrel nesting boxes on Sandy Mush Game Lands, so please keep a very respectful distance from any nesting activity.





BAILEY MOUNTAIN PRESERVE

Bailey Mountain Preserve is a wonderful place to take a look at classic western North Carolina woodland and farm environments. There is a mix of habitat, including rich cove, woods edge and



pastures. It's a great place for Black-thoated Green Warblers, Indigo Buntings, Yellow-breasted Chats, Brown Thrashers, Grey Cat Birds, Gold Finches, a variety of woodpeckers, wrens and sparrows.
